- Description** This event involves a team of 2-6 members who create an effective, dynamic and creative public health presentation. The presentation will educate the public on the annually announced topic.

2017-18 TOPIC Preventing Teen Dating Violence

Dating abuse is reaching epidemic proportions in our society. According to breakingthecycle.org, one in three high school students have experience physical or sexual violence or both by someone they are going out with. [Loveisrespect.org](http://loveisrespect.org) reports that only 33% of those in a violent relationship ever told anyone about the abuse. The Center for Disease Control and Prevention reports that being the victim of dating violence can have a negative impact on health throughout life with an increase in depression, anxiety and unhealthy behaviors. - Rules and Procedures**
1. Competitors in this event must be active members of HOSA in good standing in the division in which they are registered to compete (Secondary or Postsecondary/Collegiate).

2. Competitors must be familiar with and adhere to the "General Rules and Regulations of the HOSA Competitive Events Program (GRR)."
3. The goal of the event is to create a presentation designed to inform the public about a Public Health issue. There are no official resources for this event. Teams are encouraged to visit the website of the U.S. Public Health Service, the American Public Health Association, AND use any and all additional resources that support the development of the topic.
4. This event requires a team of 2 –6 members to perform their community presentation for a panel of judges. Presentation tools such as PowerPoint, posters, music, props, costumes, and other presentation tools may be used, with the goal of developing and presenting a creative and effective public health presentation. The presentation must effectively inform the public about public health emergencies, with reference to the annual topic, when presented to mature adolescent and adult groups in the high school and community.
5. The presentation plan and development of presentation materials must be the original work of team members.
6. The preliminary round will give each team four (4) minutes to convince the judges of the power and effectiveness of the team's community presentation. Presentation aids can be used. Index cards or electronic notecards (on a tablet, smart phone, laptop, etc) are permitted. Screens and electricity may not be used.
